Outside Riverview Centre, Langdale Road, off Bulk Road, Newton

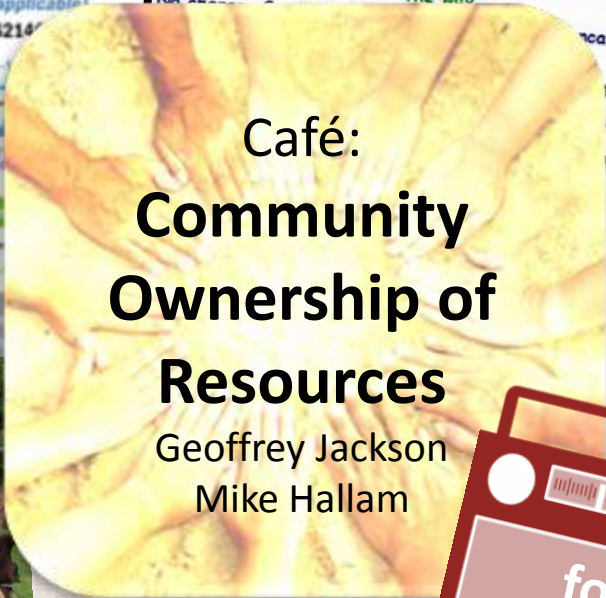

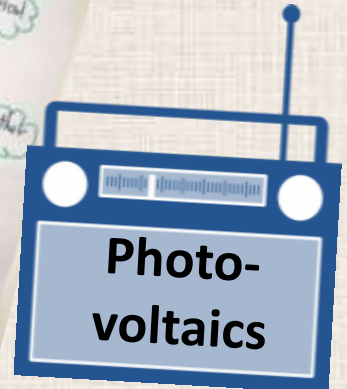
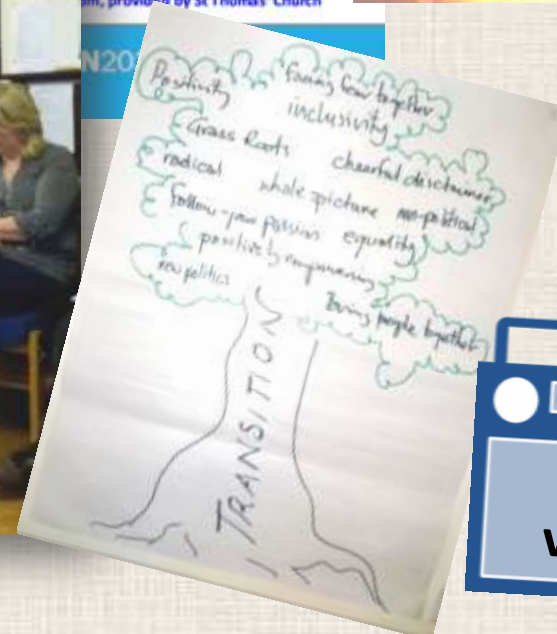
